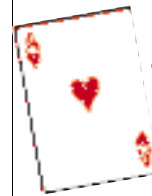

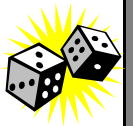
Congratulations to Jim Krupa

RULES CORNER:

I'm sure everyone got the correct answer to last month's rules quiz, right? No? Well let's go through it step by step. Joe tees off on Hole # 3 and his ball drops into the water hazard below the sycamore tree (that's 1). In searching for his ball he steps on a rock that rolls (penalty?) and he uses his club to try and catch himself as he fell (penalty?). The rock is a loose impediment which we know cannot be moved when you lie in a hazard. But because it was accidentally moved and did not affect the lie of the ball or the area of the intended swing or stance there is no penalty (Decision 13-4/13). We all know you cannot ground your club in a hazard, but because the act of touching the ground was to prevent the player from falling and it did not improve the lie of the ball no penalty is incurred (Decision 13-4/3.5). Let's continue. Joe finds his ball sitting just a few feet in front of a large embedded rock. He then takes three practice swings making contact with the ground each time

(penalty?). The player incurs a penalty of two strokes for infraction of Rule 13-4 (that's 2 & 3). In this case he is not penalized for each contact in accordance with Decision 1-4/12. Upon setting up to the ball Joe accidentally touches his ball, but it does not move (Penalty?). Simply touching the ball in a hazard is not reason for penalty if the ball does not move (Decision 13-4/12). What about the flying insect effecting Joe? The insect is considered a loose impediment under the rules and the margin of the water hazard does extend vertically. Decision 13-4/16.5 states that in equity the player is allowed to deal with the flying insect as needed. Joe then hits his ball into the fairway (that's 4). He plays his ball short of the green (that's 5), pitches on (that's 6) and two putts to complete the hole (that's 7 & 8). Did you have the correct score?
