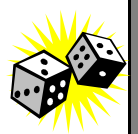

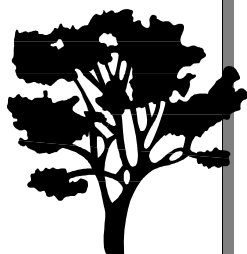

TREES!!

Alex is once again asking for donations to add some trees to the course. He would like to expand the redbuds on #12 and possibly some trees on #16 and #11. Trees cost about \$100/each.

RULES CORNER:

This month's topic centers on the golf ball. Rule 5 in the U.S.G.A. Rules of Golf gives us several items that apply to the golf ball we use in a round of golf. We will concentrate on Rule 5-3: **Ball Unfit for Play**. At one time or another we have all discovered that our golf ball has been damaged by either a poor shot or collision with some object on the course. Can we do anything about its damaged state? Or do we have to suffer through its condition until the start of the next hole? Rule 5-3 gives us the answer:



“A Ball is unfit for play if it is visibly cut, cracked or out of shape. A ball is not unfit for play solely because mud or other materials adhere to it, its surface is scratched or scraped or its paint is damaged or discolored.

If a player has reason to believe his ball has become unfit for play during play of the hole being played, he may lift the ball without penalty to determine whether it is unfit.

Before lifting the ball, the player must announce his intention to his opponent in match play or his *marker* or *fellow-competitor* in stroke play and mark the posi-

tion of the ball. He may then lift and examine it provided that he gives his opponent, *marker* or *fellow-competitor* an opportunity to examine the ball and observe the lifting and replacement. The ball must not be cleaned when lifted under Rule 5-3.

If the player fails to comply with all or any part of this procedure, he incurs a penalty of **one stroke**.

If it is determined that the ball has become unfit for play during play of the hole being played, the player may *substitute* another ball, placing it on the spot where the original ball lay. Otherwise, the original ball must be replaced.”

So there you have it. The rules do allow you to replace that damaged ball. The key wording is “*the ball has become unfit for play during play of the hole being played*”. You cannot change balls under this rule when your ball was damaged two holes ago and you just now remembered it. If you start the hole with a damaged ball the rules are not going to give you relief. But you may switch on the next tee before starting the next hole.
