We have had a slow start this season: "Weatherman, please give us some warmer weather; we want to play golf."



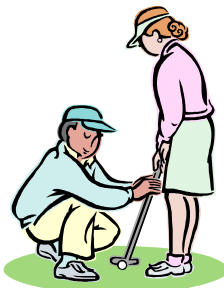

CLUB HISTORIAN

This month’s column isn’t so much a history lesson as it more “interesting” notes about your club.

In the fall of 2004 Alex did some “approximate” measurements of our greens, and the results are quite interesting. The 18 greens on our golf course total to almost exactly 2-acres of space, with the smallest green at approximately 3500 square feet, and the largest at about 6500 square feet. The average size is roughly 4819 sq.ft.


The largest green appears to be #9, at about 6500 square feet. Throw in the large swale and two tiers, and you’ve got a 3-putt paradise! The smallest? Believe it or not, #16 appears to be the baby at only 3500 sq. ft, with #11 a close second at 3850 sq. ft.

Appropriately, the six par 5 holes average the smallest greens, with an average of about 4391 sq. ft. The par 4 holes have the largest size average at 5375 sq. ft., and the par 3 holes fall in the middle at 4691 sq.ft average.

SPRINGTIME AT LAKE OF THE OZARKS

Be sure to set-up your tee times well in advance to avoid the inconvenience of not being able to get on the course when you show up to play.
